### Attendance

As you are aware, the school has to regularly monitor attendance and punctuality of every pupil. The school is aiming for an average attendance of all pupils to be 97%. As a result, the school receives visits from an Educational Social Worker to analyse the attendance of pupils. It is their role to assist families and the school to improve attendance where attendance is not considered to be at least satisfactory. You may receive letters or text alerts from the school from time to time. Please note that unless there are exceptional circumstances, the school cannot authorise holidays in term time. There are currently 33 children in the school that still have 100% attendance since the beginning of the academic year.
