How pupil premium allocation is to be spent to address barriers	Reason for allocated approach
Additional Support from teaching assistants in the classroom to facilitate small group teaching and to focus on identified children in various year groups. £14,500	To reduce the adult/pupil ratio in classes to allow greater opportunities to increase the % of children meeting the expected standards.
Specific Intervention (RWI) to focus on Key Stage 1 Phonics. £4480	To ensure children have the ability to read at the appropriate standard by increasing the % of Pupil Premium children to achieve the expected standard in the Y1 Phonics Screening check.
'Focus Room' Children to access social and emotional support via Learning Mentor £7600	To ensure that children can be prepared and be supported emotionally for learning in the classroom.
Provide targeted Literacy and Numeracy support for a small group of Y6 children using a higher learning teaching assistant. £13,000	To ensure that Pupil Premium children have improved opportunities of achieving Age Related Expectations.
Support eligible families to access after school clubs. £2000	To ensure that children's access to enrichment is not restricted by cost and the % of children accessing clubs increases.
Support eligible families by reducing the overall costs of residential visits by 50%-by agreement with the school. £2000	To ensure that eligible families can be supported to ensure that children can attend costly residential.
Support eligible families by reducing the overall costs of school clubs and instrumental tuition-by agreement with the school. £500	To increase the opportunities of children to receive musical tuition where it may not otherwise be achievable.

Extra Data audits for Pupil Premium Group e.g. data progress, attendance, observations, book scrutinies, analysis of health checks including supply. £3000	To ensure more monitoring specifically looking at pupil premium group.
